

Integration of CINAHL into the CD-ROM Program of Pittsburgh State University .

The CINAHL compact disk was introduced into the Leonard H. Axe Library of Pittsburgh State University on a trial basis for seven weeks in September, 1989 to October, 1989. A publicity campaign and user education program was conducted for the Department of Nursing, as well as the rest of the university community and the public at large. Our library resource instruction program scheduled classroom and individual instruction in the use of CINAHL. During the trial period a survey was conducted to measure the use of and satisfaction with the program. The results indicated the primary users were nursing students and faculty and the library's purchase of the product for three years.

A Workstation Approach to a Distributed Information Service presented by Jim Henderson

Canadian Bacterial Disease Network, Vancouver, B.C.

The Canadian Bacterial Diseases Network is a research organization comprised of some 50 researchers in 14 academic, commercial, and government groups from Victoria, B.C. to Quebec City. To encourage a change in the communication behaviour of the group an information service has been designed that offers various functions. The initial menu offers:
